**Ward Plan Priorities**

**Antisocial Behaviour**

**You are concerned about antisocial behaviour including drunken behaviour.**

On 24/08/22 one male was cautioned and charged with threatening and abusive behaviour in Callander and is the subject of a report to the fiscal.

On 09/09/22 a car in the Callander area was vandalised whilst parked and unattended with the paintwork being scratched. The person responsible has not been identified.

On 30/09/22 a disturbance took place in Callander which resulted in three people being charged with assault with a report being submitted to the fiscal.

## Road Safety

**You are concerned about speeding, dangerous driving and indiscriminate parking.**

On 14/08/22 a vehicle was stopped on the A84 near Callander with the driver suspected of being under the influence of alcohol. The driver refused to provide a specimen of breath when required at the roadside and was arrested. The driver later refused to provide a specimen of breath at Falkirk Police station. The driver is the subject of a report to the fiscal for refusing to provide specimens of breath when required.

On 21/08/22 a road traffic collision occurred on the A84 east of Callander. One male has been charged and reported to the fiscal with Causing serious injury by careless or inconsiderate driving and driving with no insurance.

Constables King and Deans have been carrying out speed detection duties during this time in Callander at the east end of the village as well as the west near to Tulipan Crescent.

## Theft

**You are concerned about homes being broken into and travelling criminals.**

On 17/08-18/08/22 power tools and other property was stolen from a worksite in the Callander area. Enquiries are ongoing in relation to this.

Between 01/09-09/09/22 about £250 - £300 of lead flashing was stolen from the roof of Callander Medical Practice. The persons responsible have not been identified to date.

Between the 01/07-21/09 42 lambs were stolen from farmland in the Drumloist area. The persons responsible have not been identified.

On 22/09-23/09/22 a theft by housebreaking occurred in the Callander area. The persons responsible are believed to be known to the house owner and enquiries are continuing.

On 07/10/22 a theft by shoplifting occurred at CCW, Main Street Callander. Enquiries are continuing.
