Ward Plan Priorities

Antisocial Behaviour

You are concerned about antisocial behaviour including drunken behaviour.

Late afternoon, evening on 31/10/22 staff at Callander Primary school became aware of a small fire within the wooden bike storage area. They managed to use water to extinguish this preventing any damage to the bike shelter. It appears that a group of older youths have been responsible for this but their identity is unknown. This was after the school day had finished with none of the primary pupils being present. Enquiry is continuing.

Road Safety

You are concerned about speeding, dangerous driving and indiscriminate parking.

On 18/10/22 a non-injury road traffic collision occurred in Pearl Street, Callander, with one vehicle driving off failing to stop at the scene. Enquiry is ongoing to trace the driver.

On the 30/10/22 officers on patrol came across a male riding a motorcycle on the A84 with no helmet. The rider was found to be under the influence of alcohol and the motorcycle was not road worthy. The male was arrested and charged with numerous road traffic offences and the motorcycle was seized.

Theft

You are concerned about homes being broken into and travelling criminals.

On the 14/10/22 an incident occurred in the Stirling Road area of Callander whereby a male was assaulted and had property taken from him. Enquiry has been carried out and two males were arrested and charged with Robbery, threatening and abusive behaviour and attempting to pervert the course of justice. The accused and victim in this case are associates and a report has been submitted to the Fiscal.

Overnight 27/10 – 28/10/22 two insecure cars in the Callander area were entered with property being taken from one. Enquiries are continuing but one male youth has been identified as being involved and reported to the relevant agencies.
