Callander Landscape Partnership met on February 23rd. Alongside CCC representative, ML, RJW attended in connection with the possibility of climate and community trails and with special reference to COP26.

As part of its commitment to a 5 year digital legacy under the terms of its Heritage Lottery grant, CLP is developing some online resources. The exact form of these remains to be decided, but attention is focusing on the concept of an ecomuseum and story-maps. An ecomuseum is a virtual museum (with no physical presence) that presents to visitors a representation of what a community is like. In this specific instance it would relate the community of Callander to its landscape. The principle is that the digital content should be heavily influenced by the community. The story-maps are ways on which information about a place, or a topic in a place, is presented embedded within online mapping. An example is here:

Three story-maps are proposed by the consultants: landscape & nature; history & heritage; exploring the landscape. After some discussion it was considered that climate and community might make an attractive story-map and could unlock useful funding.
