Ward Plan Priorities

Antisocial Behaviour

You are concerned about antisocial behaviour including drunken behaviour.

On the 12th February, '21, following information received from the public over a period of time, we were granted and executed a drugs search warrant in Menteith Crescent, Callander. £2000 worth of drugs were seized and a female was arrested, charged and is the subject of a report to the Procurator Fiscal.

Obtaining drugs search warrant is not an easy or quick process and we rely on information from members of the public regarding drug dealing in our communities.

We would urge anyone with information regarding the supply of drugs in our area to contact us at Callander Police Station or to contact Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.

Officers continue to receive reports of alleged breaches of Covid legislation in the Callander and wider area. These can be challenging to investigate with the level of evidence required to prove a breach of Covid legislation being the same as any other crime or offence.

Road Safety

You are concerned about speeding, dangerous driving and indiscriminate parking.

On the 27th February, '21, whilst on proactive patrol officers stopped a vehicle on the A84 near Callander and found the driver to have no insurance or MOT. The driver was charged and is the subject of a report to the fiscal.

Theft

You are concerned about homes being broken into and travelling criminals.

Overnight 1st – 2nd March, '21, a vehicle used to block access to a commercial premises at Keltie Bridge was damaged. This may have been in an attempt to commit theft at the commercial premises. Enquiries are on-going.
