Ward Plan Priorities

Antisocial Behaviour

You are concerned about antisocial behaviour including drunken behaviour.

There have been no reports of this nature during this time.

Officers continue to carry out mobile and foot patrols in the Callander area in relation to antisocial and drunken behaviour.

Road Safety

You are concerned about speeding, dangerous driving and indiscriminate parking.

On the evening of 17th February police had cause to speak to a driver in Callander and suspected them of driving whilst under the influence of alcohol. The driver refused to provide a sample of breath at the roadside, was arrested later providing a sample of breath at a Police station which was over 5 times the legal limit. The driver remained in custody appearing at court the next day. Due to the circumstances the court have been asked to consider seizing and disposing of the vehicle used.

We are aware of complaints of speeding in the Callander area and where time allows, officers will be carrying out speed detection duties.
