
#### CALLANDER CONNECT

#### **VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRE**

As at the end of June, we had welcomed over **8,000** visitors to the Visitor Information Centre so far this season! If you are interested in sharing your local knowledge with grateful visitors as a volunteer - we would love to hear from you!





We were thrilled to run two free tours of our Hydro Electric Scheme above Loch Lubnaig earlier this summer. The first community Hydro plant to be set up in the UK - it was launched in 2014 and has since helped to fund various local initiatives such as the Callander Jazz and Blues Festival, defibrillators for the Primary School and Loch Venachar Sailing Club, the Craigard lunch club for over 60s, as well as the Callander Citizens Advice Bureau - see case study below. In June, we launched our community e-bike share scheme! Thanks to funding from Cycling UK, Callander locals can rent one of our four e-bikes for between 1 and 4 weeks at a time, replacing short car journeys with a greener, more active mode of travel. #### Hydro Fund Grantee Case Study: Callander Citizens Advice Bureau

Over the past few years, the Hydro Fund, owned by CCDT, has granted more than £70k for a caseworker from Citizens Advice Bureau to come to Callander each week to offer their life changing services to those in short-term crisis here. Some of this money has also gone towards creating a Community Support Fund, which can be accessed and distributed locally by CAB, to those who most need it.

In the last year, this funding has helped unlock more than £360k (that we know of) in benefits and financial support for the almost 700 individuals who used it. More simply, for every £1 given by the Hydro Fund, about £17 has been gained in statutory aid to around a staggering 20% of Callander's population.

"Receiving the CCDT fund at the time of crisis and not having to wait days or weeks for a decision about an application was life changing in that moment."

#### CCDT Member Spotlight: Greener Callander

Greener Callander is a group of volunteers who grow and nurture several green initiatives in the town. From the hanging baskets on Main Street, to the Friendship and Frerichs Gardens, to the St Kessogs beds and more. They do a wonderful job growing plants and flowers in their own gardens, planting them up in the Callander Hostel polytunnels, and delivering them around Callander. At their recent annual plant sale they raised over £1,000, which will pay for next year's plants! New volunteers are always welcome! Follow Greener Callander on Facebook for more information.

### LATEST NEWS

many of you will be aware, the recent announcement of the closures of our local post office and bank has caused significant concern among residents and businesses.

In light of these closures, CCDT and Callander Community Council are actively exploring viable solutions to ensure that the needs of the community continue to be met. Our primary goal is to find a sustainable alternative that will maintain the essential service provided by the post office, hopefully also incorporating a banking hub.

A task force comprising members of both organisations has been established to reach out to stakeholders to discuss what the options could be, should no other solution be forthcoming, and we will be seeking community input on our findings.
